Channel Islands Group of Professional Engineers Treasures Report

2019

This year has been the first year where the IET follow a single year for accounting. Previous years were October to September where now it is January to December.

In the main account, which provides the services to both Jersey and Guernsey, we received funding from the IET equating to £7,029, of this £1750 is related to educational events. Our allocated funding for this year was £9,607. This leaves £2,578 plus £1,750 to be credited to the account. Due to not receiving this tranche of funding we have been unable to complete some of the elements we have requested in the budgeting we completed in 2018. Much of this shortfall has led to events such as the Engineering forum not being undertaken, some of the site visits (with marketing material) and replacement of some of the marketing material. We are in discussion with the IET to understand how this shortfall, which also occurred last year will be rectified.

This year the account opened with £198 and held £3,224.67 in provisions & accruals. As some of these provisions were historical, there were written off. We had funding of £11,225.64 comprising of the £7,029 from the IET, opening balance and income from sales of the dinners of £3,998.64. Giving available funds of £11,027.64. A total expenditure of £12,699.38. We hold £1,250 in provisions at this time. We currently have £1,265.26 in the account so an end of year balance of £15.26 is available. These accounts will be audited in the new year.

The Jersey account has been changed to be the trading account (the concept is so that we can generate income from items such as training to then help put on other courses). As reported in 2018 we had to support the main account with funds from this account and it was depleted to an opening balance of £325.19. Whilst income has been received it was related to payments for dinners so that has been cross charged to the main account. The end balance is £325.19 as we have been unable to recover the transferred funds. This is an ongoing issue and we hope that we will be able to use some of the payments not received yet to the main account to replenish this account.

The IET are currently auditing out 2018 accounts and we hope to resolve some of these issues over the next few weeks.

2020 looks to strong year, we have applied for a budget of £10,230 and have been awarded £8,969. We have been asked to apply for educational support items separately, so we hope to have an operational budget close to that requested. The IET commented on the following:

The Finance Committee would like to offer the following feedback on your budget submission:

- Your event plan contains many interesting events covering a variety of different engineering topics
- Supplementing the event programme with external funding is commendable
- · It is pleasing to see a good selection of events aimed primarily at young members.

This we think is a good response and we are looking to work with the IET more to help them understand how we operate.

As another year finishes, recall when I first joined the committee in 2009 where we received a lot less in support and funding and I hope that the events we provide continue to inspire engineers and the public in the channel islands and we continue to develop our relationship with our funder; the IET, ICE, and IstructE.

Have a good Christmas and we will see you next year.

Jersey Chair Report 2019

2019 has been a successful year for CIGPE as projects we have been working on for the past couple of years have become well established. Our work with the education department in promoting engineering as a career has gained massive traction with over 30 local schools having had some form of engineering lesson or presentation on engineering this year, and that is set to double next year.

The civil engineering HNC is going into its second year, with a new cohort due in 2020, along with the BEng element of the degree starting in 2020 also.

We organised a card board boat race again this year following the success of last year. This was bigger and better than last year with & schools taken part, and local

Lectures

This year's lectures where organised by our Guernsey colleagues and there was an impressive array of speakers, which provided us with some very interesting and entertaining lectures.

The dinners prior to lectures continue to be a success and provide a good networking opportunity for the Islands' engineering community. We have had a steady number of people attending the lectures, but unfortunately we have been disappointed with our attendance numbers for this year, despite more regular mailing to members.

We have gained more local press this year with some local journalists attending talks. Our November talk on tidal energy had a news story on the front page of the Jersey Evening Post, which is estimated to have a daily readership of close to 50,000 people. Hopefully this will generate interest for next year's talks. We have all speakers for next year booked in already and have an interesting array of talks. Our efforts to promote the lectures will continue and we will have to have some imaginative ideas to gain further publicity.

The format for the school's talks is well established now and continues to prove popular. We now have a wider range of schools attending the talks, and this year had the opportunity for one of our speakers to give a presentation to school children on a live construction site. We have also experimented with recording the lectures in the schools which will enable us to show to a wider audience in the future.

Other Events

Following the success of our inaugural cardboard boat race last year, we expanded the event this year with more teams across more schools. This was again a great success and received good press coverage. The event is now established with local schools very keen to patriciate, and this event will go ahead again next year.

CIGPE were again involved with the Jersey Skills Show, which gains popularity every year. This year we expanded on display items, but it was clear with all participants from the various industries 'upping their game' we will have to produce a more interactive display for next year's event to attract interest. This has already been discussed by the committee and will be focused on nearer the time.

Schools / Career Promotion

The civil engineering HNC completed its first year in 2019, with the cohort due to complete in 2020, with all students keen to progress onto the BEng. The first year results were extremely positive with all students gaining high marks. CIGPE have been instrumental with this success and facilitating local engineers to teach on the course. We are hoping there is demand to establish a 2020 cohort and are currently engaging the local workforce to find employment vaccines as well as potential students. Events will be planned in the new year to promote this course.

2019 saw the establishment of 'Primary and Secondary Engineer' education programme being run by a UK company in conjunction with Skills Jersey. Dozens of CIGPE members have volunteered their time to go into schools to assist with engineering lessons with the majority of the islands schools now taken part in this scheme. CIGPE are very proud of the part they have played in helping to facilitate this scheme.

Website/communications

The work done last year to update our website and mailing list has borne fruit with the mailing system working well in communicating our messages and fliers.

In summary, this has been another successful year for CIGPE. Going into 2020 the committee is looking strong which bodes well for succession plan going into next year. Our hard work the past few years in establishing links with the education department has been a great success, with many schools now proactivity seeking engineering talks and events being well attended. There has been plenty of publicity for CIGPE and the engineering this year and it certainly seems there is an excitement and interest within our colleagues in the education department about what we do.
